

## **Guidelines for Arkansas JSHS Participation**

These statements will serve as guidelines for a practical, safe, and pleasant environment during our two days together. Teachers and students are engaged in an intense educational and social program. We can enjoy ourselves better if we know what is expected.

All students must be transported to all events in teachers' cars or vans as well as to and from the symposium itself. Every teacher will be assigned students to be responsible for throughout the Symposium. In this way, each student will have a designated teacher to report to for check-in times, or for help. It is the students' responsibility to know their supervising teacher's name and room number so they may contact him/her as needed. In addition, it is the teachers' responsibility to know their students names and room numbers.

Be prompt. You are to be present at all scheduled events unless special permission is give by the director. Stay with the JSHS group. Respect property rights. No students may go into areas which they have not been given permission.

## Behavior while in hotel:

- No long distance calls will be made from the rooms unless made collect. Telephones will be used only for necessary communication.
- Girls will only be allowed in other girls' rooms
- Boys will only be allowed in other boys' rooms
- Excessive noise will not be tolerated, especially after 9:00 pm
- Any damage to hotel property will not be tolerated
- A curfew time will be announced each night based on events after this time, each student will be in his or her assigned room until breakfast time.

If the above rules are violated, the student will be sent home at his or her parents expense; in addition, the students school will be notified.

Extreme situations will be evaluated in a case-by-case manner by the Arkansas JSHS Board of Directors.
