

Dynamics is a sophomore level mechanical engineering class which is normally taken during students' fourth semester of work. The primary pre-requisite class for Dynamics is MCEG 2013, Statics which has pre-requisites of Physics I and Calculus II. Therefore, it is very common for the department to have students request an exemption from the Differential Equations pre-requisite requirement in order to stay "on-track" in their studies. The course content of Dynamics includes very few topics in which Differential Equations applies and the level of equations used is of the simplest type which can be easily understood by students who have successfully completed Calculus II.

Evaluation of achievement of course objectives in this class by instructors over the past two to three years, during which time the Differential Equations pre-requisite was routinely exempted for a significant number of students, shows no detrimental effects due to students not having taken Differential Equations prior to Dynamics.

It has been the accepted practice to assume that, since MCEG 2023 is **usually** one of the first ME courses taken by students, that they would invariably have completed it prior to taking MCEG 3013. 

In 2009, the Speech faculty successfully advocated the addition of a course, Sph 2023:

Communication Research and Writing, in order to improve the written communication skills of speech majors. At the time of its institution, the course was made a necessary prerequisite for many upper-division Speech courses. However, in practice, these prereqs have created an advising headache for Speech and have had the effect of inhibiting students from outside the major from taking Speech courses. For this reason, the Speech faculty have chosen to re-evaluate the preregs for all Speech courses. In general, we want to move away from prereqs for most of our upper-division courses. The discipline of Speech Communication is varied with many tracks for students---for instance, rhetoric, organizational communication, interpersonal communication, and performance studies. Since these tracks are of interest to majors across the university, the Speech faculty would like to make it easier for such students to take our courses. We can continue to work toward our goal of improved student writing through astute advising---i.e., encouraging students to take Sph 2023 early in their academic careers---rather than through prerequisite requirements. We are leaving Sph 2023 as a prered for Sph 4003, our most seniorlevel required majors course.

Additionally, while reviewing our course prereqs, it was decided that we should add the prereq of "instructor consent" to our debate practica: these courses give credit to members of the debate team; and we want to avoid having students take that course who are not on or interested in the team. Also, we decided to add the prereqs of our introductory courses---Sph 1003 and Sph 2003---to our most advanced seminar, Sph 4003: Human Communication. We are adding these prereqs in response to Arkansas Act 747: by adding these prereqs, we will ensure that transfer students have the taken the necessary lower-level speech courses in order to gain mastery of the subject.

Most of our students already take Circuits Lab (ELEG 2111) before Electronics (ELEG 3103) so this should not significantly impact our department. Furthermore this does not change the scope or focus of the course it merely closes loopholes in advising.

Please provide a rationale for the change including the evidence derived from your program assessment that justifies this change. Assessment evidence may come from direct and indirect measures of student learning as well as analysis of the current state of the discipline.

According to our degree program our students should take Circuits Lab (ELEG 2111) in their sophomore year (the semester before Electronics). We have recently enhanced our Electronics course to be more of a *studio* experience. In this format we lecture then go directly to the lab and have the students build devices or measure quantities that reinforce the material that was just covered. The exams are now two part exams: (1) an in-class portion that covers theory and (2) a lab portion that stresses design applications. In order for a student to succeed in this type of course the student must know how to build circuits, operate measurement devices, and take electrical measurements. These concepts are learned in Circuits Lab (ELEG 2111). As mentioned above most of our students already take Circuits Lab (ELEG 2111) before Electronics, however there has been a case when a student did not complete the lab but was enrolled in Electronics. This proposal would take care of this scenario.

Most of our students already take General Physics 2 (PHYS 2124) and Calculus 3 (MATH 2934) before Electromagnetics (ELEG 3143) so this should not significantly impact either the physics or math departments. Furthermore this does not change the scope or focus of the course it merely closes loopholes in advising.

Please provide a rationale for the change including the evidence derived from your program assessment that justifies this change. Assessment evidence may come from direct and indirect measures of student learning as well as analysis of the current state of the discipline.

According to our degree program our students should take General Physics 2 (PHYS 2124) and Calculus 3 (MATH 2934) in their sophomore year, almost a full year before taking Electromagnetics. General Physics 2 gives a brief overview of the fundamentals of vector calculus and Maxwell's Equations. Calculus 3 also covers vector calculus. These are the foundations of the course in Electromagnetics. The department has data that shows students that have not taken General Physics 2 before Electromagnetics do not perform as well on the exams as though students who have taken the course.

As mentioned above most of our students do take both General Physics 2 and Calculus 3 before Electromagnetics but some slip through. On average there typically is only one or two students in the course that have not taken these courses in the appropriate sequence so this should not significantly impact either department.
