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B. RESTATEMENT OF PROJECT

I, along with Dr. Christine Austin another CSP faculty member, presented at the Higher Learning Commission's 2015 Annual Conference in Chicago, IL on March 29, 2015. The session's title was, Practical Guidance for Co-curricular Assessment to Meet Updated HLC Criteria.

C. BRIEF REVIEW OF PROJECT

The presentation provided an overview of HLC criteria, assessment steps, and practical strategies for conducting co-curricular assessment. Examples of effective outcomes and assessment measures were provided by the presenters and the audience was invited to develop and share examples.

D. SUMMARY OF EXPERIENCE

Over 200 conference participants attended the session and participated in the session's activities. Participants asked questions during and after the session and several requested additional information from the presenters. In addition to presenting I was able to attend sessions offered by other presenters.
