Deans' Meeting Agenda Tuesday, September 18 at 1:00pm Academic Affairs

I. Dr. Brett Bruner, Dean of Student Engagement

Dr. Brunner introduced himself to the group and let them know he is available to help with anything.

II. Tammy Weaver – Summer/Fall Schedule

There is a push to enroll new students earlier. In a collaborative effort, Dr. Warnick, Student Affairs, and the Advising Center are working on a model to register new students earlier and in batches. The Advising Center will take on the extra workload. This potential change would begin registration 2-3 weeks before spring break. The idea would be for students to be advised as a group, in about one hour increments, and Orientation Leaders would step in at that point.

III. Promotion & Tenure Guidelines

Dr. Bridgmon asked the group if they have established their DPTC guidelines. These need to be established before the review process.

Action: Please confirm with the your department heads the list of faculty who requested to follow the 2017-2018 is correct. Have guidelines by the end of the semester. These will be posted on the Academic Affairs website.

IV. Graduate Dean Search

Dr. Bean updated the group about the Graduate College Dean search. The committee has been assembled and the Search Firm, Higher Education Leadership, has been selected to assist with the search. The goal is to have the candidate identified before Thanksgiving.

V. Admissions Test

VIII. Budget, Fees, and Priorities

These priorities can be one-time or recurring. Discussion regarding a college fee was discussed. This kind of fee could lead to less transparency.

Action: Pat will send out an email with an excel spreadsheet for budget priorities.

IX. MOU – NorthArk

HLC will need to approve the NorthArk site before classes can be offered. The challenge now is to identify a program that can be offered at NorthArk and a start date. The idea is to offer a Bachelor of Arts degree. Dr. Bridgmon indicated NorthArk's desire to have an Agri or Business program. Concerns were raised about who would be teaching the courses. Thoughts circled around a combo of ATU faculty, NorthArk faculty, online courses and using qualified adjuncts in the area.

Action: Deans be thinking about a program to offer at NorthArk.
