MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between BAPTIST HEALTH College Little Rock (hereinafter the "College"), and Arkansas Tech University (hereinafter the "University"), which have agreed to cooperate for the purpose of assisting licensed graduates from the BAPTIST HEALTH College Little Rock – School of Nursing Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree and diploma program to complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree. It is the intent of the parties by entering into this Agreement to offer students a seamless, online degree completer option which includes general education and pre-nursing prerequisites as well as credit for prior nursing courses and prior nursing experience to increase the number of BSN credentialed registered nurses in the state of Arkansas.

II. POINTS OF AGREEMENT

OWNERSHIP:

- 1. The University shall have total ownership of the RN to BSN Completer Program (hereinafter "Program"). Administration, management, and operation of the Program shall be the responsibility of the University.
- 2. All NURN courses included in the Program curriculum will be taught by faculty of the University. The University shall have the exclusive right to determine and make all financial, technical and professional policies related to the NURN courses. The University shall have full and complete ownership of all NURN courses and exclusive control over the administration, management and operation of those courses.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION:

3. Students will apply to the Program through the University, which has exclusive responsibility for admission to the Program.

The University reserves the right to not select an applicant to the Program based upon a deficiency in one or more admission requirements. Although the University is committed to accepting qualified applicants and will strive to adjust appropriately if the number of qualified applicants increases due to this Agreement, each party understands and agrees that academic qualification does not guarantee a student's admission to the Program. In addition to meeting the required academic qualifications, a student's admission to the Program will be contingent on whether space is available in the program for students. Space availability will be solely determined by the department head of the Arkansas Tech University Nursing Program. The criteria for making the determination of adequate space availability will be sufficient faculty to teach the courses required for Program completion.

- 4. BHSLR-School of Nursing graduates will be considered qualified applicants if they meet the following criteria:
 - a) Applicant must be a licensed registered nurse and meet Arkansas Tech University admission criteria.
 - b) Applicant must have completed a minimum of 61 hours of general education with a 2.75 minimum grade point average in the required general education and pre-requisite courses.
 - c) Applicant must present a letter from employer documenting work experience if over 12 months since graduation; and
 - d) Applicant must submit all application documentation as required by the University.

GENERAL EDUCATION:

- 5. Program applicants have the option of taking the required general education courses at any accredited college or university. The University is committed to honoring the articulation agreement which outlines the general education courses that will be accepted through Pulaski Technical College (Addendum). The University shall have the exclusive right to determine the transferability of courses from colleges and universities other than Pulaski Technical College.
- 6. The College and the University are committed to student-friendly articulation practices and commit that the following Pulaski Technical College courses which are taken as part of the School nursing program will fulfill the corresponding general education requirements needed to enter the Program.

7. The University is committed to working with recent and future School graduates that have general education requirements through Pulaski Technical College. The University

is equally committed to School graduates from past years that have general education requirements through Henderson State University.

THE PROGRAM:

8. The University is committed to offering the Program in a web-based format with clinical experiences in the student's home community. The University expects minimum time from students on the University campus.

III. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The parties to this Agreement are independent contractors, and neither parties' employees shall have the authority to exercise any control over the professional judgment or methods used by the other party in the performance of the duties set forth in this Agreement.

IV. QUALITY ASSURANCE

The two parties shall work together harmoniously and cooperatively to assure that standards are upheld and students receive the best educational experiences possible. Officials and faculty of the School or University, upon reasonable request, will have the right to visit the University or School at any time to review the curriculum and resources.

V. ACCREDITATION

The University is accredited by The Higher Learning Commission. The University Department of Nursing is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing.

The College is accredited by the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools. The BHCLR-School of Nursing is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing.

VI. ASSIGNMENT AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement may not be assigned by any party hereto without the expressed written consent of all parties.

This Agreement contains the entire agreement of all parties hereto, and no other oral or written agreement shall be binding on the parties hereto. This Agreement may not be amended or otherwise modified, unless agreed to by all parties, in writing. This Agreement supersedes all other agreements, contracts, understandings, representations, whether written or otherwise, between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof.

VII. TERM AND TERMINATION

The initial term of this Agreement shall begin January 25, 2019 and end January 24, 2020. Thereafter, this Agreement will be automatically renewed for successive periods of one year each unless written notice is provided to all parties prior to each October 1st. In order to protect the interests of the University/College students, this Agreement may not be terminated prior to

the end of a school year by any party. In the event of termination of the Program at the end of a regular semester, any particular class of students enrolled in the Program at the time of termination will be guaranteed the option to complete the Program and provisions will be made for the completion of the Program in the event that the Agreement is terminated during that particular class's program of study.

This Agreement may be terminated at the end of a regular semester upon occurrence of any of the following events:

- (1) By written mutual agreement of the parties hereto;
- (2) Destruction or damage to the University buildings or their contents by fire, explosion, terrorism or natural disaster;
- (3) The occurrence of any other contingency or the happening of any other event or series of events or contingencies resulting in the University being deprived of sufficient funds to enable it to operate successfully.

VIII. CHOICE OF LAW

This Agreement shall be interpreted according to and enforced under the laws of the State of Arkansas.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between BAPTIST HEALTH College Little Rock (hereinafter the "College"), and Arkansas Tech University (hereinafter the "University"), which have agreed to cooperate for the purpose of providing pre-nursing majors from the University who are not admitted to the upper division nursing major, a plan B for obtaining a registered nurse license and ultimately a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

II. POINTS OF AGREEMENT

OWNERSHIP:

- 1. The College shall have total ownership of the RN Associate of Applied Science in Nursing Program (hereinafter "AAS Program"). Administration, management, and operation of the AAS Program shall be the responsibility of the College.
- 2. All NSG courses included in the AAS Program curriculum will be taught by faculty of the College. The College shall have the exclusive right to determine and make all financial, technical and professional policies related to the NSG courses. The College shall have full and complete ownership of all NUR courses and exclusive control over the administration, management and operation of those courses.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION:

- 3. Students will apply to the Program through the College, which has exclusive responsibility for admission to the Program.
 - The College reserves the right to not select an applicant to the AAS Program based upon a deficiency in one or more admission requirements. Academic qualification does not guarantee a student's admission to the Program. In addition to meeting the required academic qualifications, a student's admission to the AAS Program will be contingent on whether space is available in the program for students. Space availability will be solely determined by the College.
- 4. ATU Pre-licensure students will be considered qualified applicants if they meet the following criteria:
 - a) Applicant must have completed a minimum of 31 hours of general education as specified in the AAS curriculum with a 2.75 minimum grade point average.
 - b) Applicant must submit all application documentation as required by the College.

GENERAL EDUCATION:

- 5. Program applicants have the option of taking the required general education courses at any accredited college or university.
- 6. The College and the University are committed to student-friendly articulation practices and commit that the following Arkansas Tech University courses which are taken as part of the University nursing program will fulfill the corresponding general education requirements needed to enter the AAS Program.
