Patrick Haggae- Goodbye Arkansas, Hello Arkansas: A Map-Focused Look at Our Rapidly Changing State

Massive changes in population, economy, and power are rearranging the human geography of Arkansas. The eastern Delta region continues its long downhill slide, while Northwest Arkansas is a center of near-endless growth. This map-focused talk examines how regions of Arkansas have already changed, as well as projections of our state's future. By 2050, Arkansas will be more urban, more dominated by Northwest Arkansas, and less culturally 'southern'.

Jacob Grosskopf- Galapagos Islands: Why They Are Even More Important Than You Think

The Galapagos Islands are best known for the site which Charles Darwin developed his important work on natural selection and evolution. What many do not know is the Galapagos Islands have a rich geologic history, to the point of altering the Earth's ocean currents and building a land bridge between North America and South America, leading to global changes in Earth's climate and biological geography. This talk explores how the Galapagos Islands formed, how this is different from normal volcanism, and the series of events that altered the Earth to the current climate and continent configuration it is in today.

Tim Trawick- Arkansas Fiddler
