

The sixth annual Arkansas Governor's School for Gifted and Talented rising high school seniors from the entire state of Arkansas continued in the tradition of being a national pacesetter as a unique educational experience. It is a six-week summer residential program designed to focus on the development of intellectual skills that will be critical in solving 21st Century problems. It is neither an acceleration of high school nor an anticipation of college. The program is fully funded by the State Legislature through the State Department of Education on contract with Hendrix College.

The 1985 AGS was opened by Governor Bill Clinton and featured an address by Senator Dale Bumpers, along with a special flag-raising ceremony on the fourth of July. Some highlights of the session were an extra performance by A.R.T., exclusively for the '85 AGS, of "The Good Woman of Setzuan;" addresses by Gregorc, Murphy, Bates, West, Bleeker, Dennett, Ruse, Three for All, and Gilchrist; a coffee house and excerpts from Feiffer's People performed by the faculty and staff; a variety show by students; the films "Das Boot," "Lord of the Flies," "Patch of Blue," "Caine Mutiny," "Night and Fog," and "Wise Blood;" the 20th-Century Music Concerts and performances of "David and Lisa" by AGS students.

If the spirit of the '85 AGS is contagious, the world will be a better place to live.
