

The seventh annual Arkansas Governor's School was opened by Governor Bill Clinton and his wife, Hillary, on the Sunday marking the weekend celebration of Arkansas' Sesquicentennial. The Arkansas Governor's School is a unique educational program designed to focus on the sharpening of intellectual skills, the nurturing of creativity, and the development of the personal and social consciousness essential for 21st Century problem solving.

The fully residential program is designed to create an optimum academic-arts learning environment for Arkansas' gifted and talented students. Funding of the program by the State Legislature through the Arkansas Education Department makes it possible for all 400 students to attend without personal expenditure. Many individuals and groups have worked diligently to establish, fund, and implement this nationally pacesetting experiment in gifted and talented education. The overwhelming success of this year's program reflects the quality of their efforts and the exceptional nature of the students, faculty, and staff participating in the 1986 AGS.

Students attend two Area I classes daily and one on Saturday, as well as three Area II and three Area III classes each week. Many of the topics discussed in class were rediscussed in less formal settings around the campus. One highlight of the 1986 AGS was a full slate of morning and afternoon guest speakers; some were entertaining, some were controversial, but all were thought provoking for those who listened. Other memorable events were performances by the Arkansas Repertory Theater of "Quilters" (in spite of blowing electrical fuses twice), 20th Century music concerts, drama performances, art exhibits, various film series (including the weird "shorts"), literary arts video magazine, and the 4th of July convocation when Senator Pryor announced the opportunity for 15 AGS students to visit with a delegation of Soviet citizens.

The AGS experience appears to be almost impossible to put into words. It ranges from esoteric epistemological theories and factual details through the simple but overwhelming personal pleasure of discovery of new ideas and art forms to the social sharing of these with new friends (even after curfew). Although the experience was intellectually enriching, some of the most significant memories will be of the extra-academic recreational, cultural, and social events. All of us made enduring friendships along the way.
