


### AREA I-

Alice Hines is Coordinator of Academic Disciplines and Michael Bates is the Coordinator of Performing Arts.











### AREA II - GENERAL CONCEPTUAL DEVELOPMENT

Area II curriculum is designed to enhance conceptual development. Classroom discussion then lead students to progress to deeper levels of intellectual reflection which enhances their ability to become better thinkers.


