# AREA II

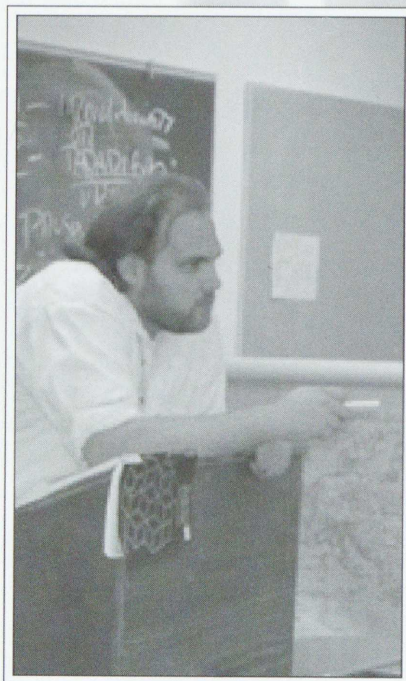
## GENERAL CONCEPTUAL DEVELOPMENT

*The Area II curriculum is designed to enhance conceptual development. Students are encouraged to learn more about how knowledge is acquired (epistemology) and to understand the various ways of knowing in different disciplines. In striving to increase their ability to analyze diverse perspectives on current normative issues, students gain a new appreciation for their implications. Classroom discussion then leads students to progress to deeper levels of intellectual reflection, which enhances their ability to become better thinkers.*

## PERSONAL AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

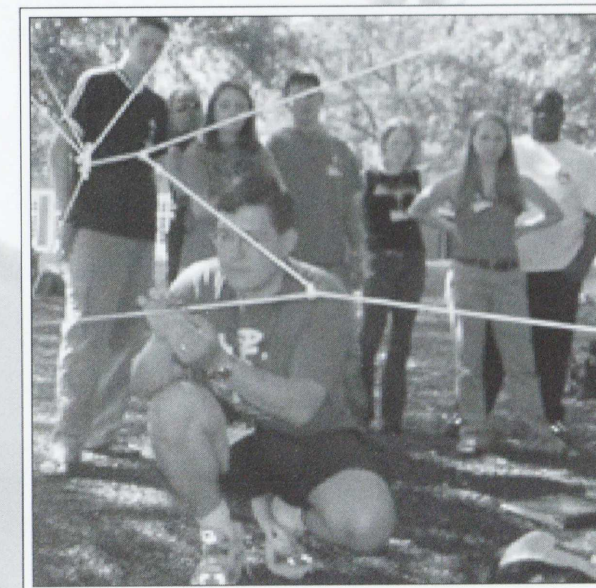
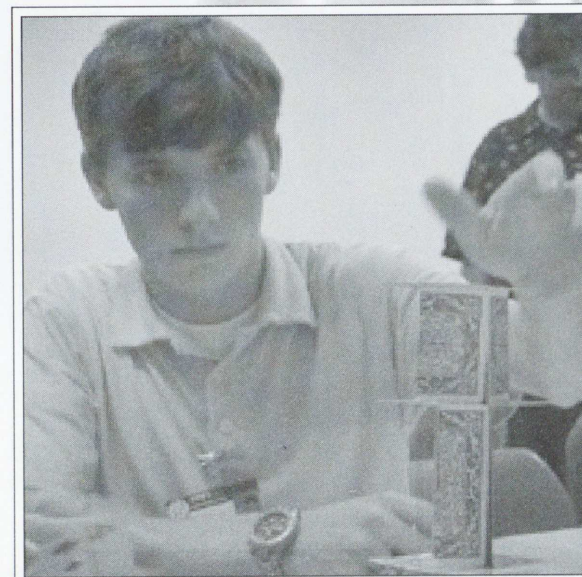
*Area III attempts to create an environment in which students inquire into the nature of their individual abilities and the responsibility they have to their respective communities.*
