## BACHELOR OF ARTS IN PUBLIC HISTORY

The baccalaureate degree in public history prepares students for careers in historic preservation as well as museum and archive management.

The public history degree requires forty eight (48) additional semester hours beyond the General Education requirements and the College of Arts and Humanities foreign language requirement.

#### **General Education Required Courses**

Public history majors are required to take six (6) hours of beginning foreign language courses or obtain the appropriate waiver for high school language
