CAEP Measure 4 (Initial & Advanced Licensure Programs) Ability to Be Hired in the Preparation Field

The Arkansas Tech University (ATU) College of Education and Health has continued to prepare educators who are employed at or above the state employment average for first-year teachers. In addition, the ATU College of Education and Health has continued to prepare educators in advanced licensure levels who have been employed during the first year after graduation. Advanced Licensure includes licensure areas that teachers normally add to their educator license through coursework and testing. These advanced level licenses are in such areas as educational leadership, library media, special education, and others. The table below indicates the hiring percentages for program graduates in the fields for which they were prepared.
