Senior COSTEP: Commissioned Officer Student Training and Extern Program

What is Senior COSTEP?



The *Senior Commissioned Officer Student Training and Extern Program* (COSTEP) is offered by the U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) Commissioned Corps to attract highly motivated students to the Corps.

Students in select fields of study are commissioned as Ensigns (O-1) in the PHS during the last year of academic study toward their qualifying degree.

As an Ensign, the COSTEP student receives base pay (currently \$2655 for officers without prior active duty service), <u>plus</u> non-taxable allowances for subsistence and housing (varies with geographic location and dependency status). The <u>average</u> level of support totals nearly \$3700/month.

In return for financial support, COSTEP participants agree to an assignment at the sponsoring government agency after graduation equal to twice the period of sponsorship. For example, if a student is sponsored for a period of 9 months, his or her payback obligation would be 18 months.

After graduation, the COSTEP officers are promoted to a higher rank, depending on specialty, and receive salary and allowances commensurate with their rank.

Where can Sr COSTEP Participants work?
