Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT)

Comprehensive evidence-based care from a multi-disciplinary team of experts for help with alcohol and opioid use to include:

- Individual and group therapy
- Management of medically necessary medications and interventions
- Life-saving treatment

Mental Health for SUD

Comprehensive mental health outpatient care utilizing a care model based on industry proven strategies and outcomes for:

- Psychiatric services
- Individual and group therapy

Chronic Pain Program

Evidenced-based care for long-term pain management as part of SUD treatment focusing on functional restoration with:

- Medication and non-medication therapies
- Mindfulness
- Cognitive-behavioral therapy (CBT) (a type of therapy that helps people learn how to identify and change negative or disturbing thoughts that may influence emotions)
- Operant therapy (focuses on how the brain perceives rewards and punishments as it applies to specific behaviors)
