What is a CMA?

CMA stands for Certified Medication Assistant (formerly MA-C). A CMA is a person who is certified by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing to administer certain medications in designated facilities. This program will include the new expanded scope of practice for CMAs.

What are the requirements for the CMA Program?

- Be in good standing with the state CNA registry
- Be currently employed at a designated facility
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Complete the accuplacer literacy and reading comprehension screening process

What can a CMA do?

A CMA may perform the delegated function of medication administration and related tasks under the supervision of a licensed nurse to no more than 40 patients a shift.

What routes can a CMA administer medication?

Oral-Buccal - Sublingual, Intranasal, Topical, Eye, Ear or
Nose Drops, Vaginal, Rectal, Transdermal, Inhalation, and
Subcutaneous Injection of Insulin.
