Presidents Concert

The President's Concert Project was a cooperative project between Arkansas Tech Music faculty, Arkansas Tech students, and the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra. The final product of this project was an orchestral concert presented on February 14, 2006. From a research and creative standpoint, the project had two specific goals. First is to gain pedagogical insight into the performance of a standard solo repertoire work by performing it in its original orchestration, not a piano reduction of the accompaniment. Dr. Kelly Johnson is interested in how her approach to performing and teaching the Mozart Clarinet Concerto would be altered by playing it in its original form. Dr. Johnson performed the first movement of the concert on the concert and was not only able to demonstrate the solo in its original form for her clarinet students, but was able to perform it with orchestra herself for the first time. The most significant knowledge to come from this performance was the limits of flexibility with regard to tempoof the full orchestra versus a piano reduction, and the orchestration details not revealed in the piano reduction. The second outcome of this project was to provide an orchestral performance experience for faculty and students. Wind and percussion players were recruited from the ranks of Tech students and faculty, and string players were hired through the Arkansas Symphony office. This was the primary expense for the project. The project allowed for active participation of students, faculty, and qualified community members in full rehearsals, section rehearsals, and a performance of the following standard orchestra works:
