### ABSTRACT:

I have been asked to present 3 sessions at the Arkansas Association Instructional Media Annual Conference in Hot Springs on April 9-11, 2006. This is a request for funds to be able to participate in the conference.

### PURPOSE/OBJECTIVES:

The Arkansas Association of Instructional Media will hold their annual conference at the Hot Springs Conference Center/Austin Hotel in Hot Springs, AR on April 9-11, 2006. This is a request for travel expenses to attend the conference and participate by presenting 3 sessions based upon research interests. Two sessions were specifically requested by the conference planners. The estimated project funds requested are for registration, mileage, lodging, and meals. The breakdown is below:

### SIGNIFICANCE/NEED:

The membership of AAIM is made up of technology coordinators, school library media specialists, and classroom teachers. The featured speaker at the conference is Dr. Michael Eisenberg, co-author of The Big 6, an information literacy model, heavily used in the K-12 environment. His materials are used in the library media classes I teach and attending his sessions will greatly enhance that instruction. He is the keynote speaker at two of the general sessions. In addition, the three sessions I am presenting will give the

attendees information they can use. I chair the state primary book awards committee, The Arkansas Diamond Award. By conference time, the reading list for the 2006-07 school year will have been selected by my committee. This conference is the first introduction of the new list to the school media specialists and gives information from the committee they may not receive from other sources. The second session is about the 65% Solution in Education Reform that has been adopted by several states. I have been asked to write an article for the AAIM Journal and present a session on what the 65% solution is, who is behind it, and how it would impact school library media specialists. The third session is about the usage of the free online databases and the free video streaming available in Arkansas school media centers.

The information gained at the conference will be shared with other faculty members in my department.
