Classrooms across America are filled with students who are hardworking, active and success oriented. Likewise, there are students who struggle academically and behaviorally. Within this mix of students we also find a group of children who are often overlooked by teachers in the course of daily events. These overlooked children come to class, go quietly about their business, and have little interaction with the adults within their school environment. A challenge faced by teachers and school personnel is to find a way to bring these children more into the mainstream of classroom activity.

It has long been noted that the classroom teacher can have a tremendous effect on students, either in a positive or negative manner. A simple approach which may have great benefit in transforming the overlooked students in a classroom into the mainstream of activity could be a positive communication from the teacher to the child's parent.

This approach was tried with outstanding results. The presentation will present results obtained and demonstrate how easily this approach can be used, and the impact that it can have on students, teachers and parents.

C. Purpose

The purpose of this presentation is to provide teachers with a simple and often overlooked method of encouraging student achievement and social interaction. 
