Abstract:

Dementia Day Camp VI is a yearly cooperative and educational venture between a number of researchers and clinical therapeutic recreation practitioners that has taken place since 2001. The intent of the event is to bring together these individuals in a workgroup environment that will focus on specific outcomes with targeted, early stage intervention working sessions. The goal of the workgroup is to write a R21 \$100,000 grant.

Purpose/Objectives:

The goal of DDC VI will be to target early stage, intervention research during a series of interactive, engaging, and fun working sessions on the coast of Southern Maine with the expected outcome to be a R21 100,000.

Significance/Need:

This is an invitation only workgroup that will focus on specific outcomes with targeted, early intervention working sessions for individuals with Alzheimer's disease/dementia, with the overall goal of writing a R21 \$100,000 grant. The Hartford Center for Geriatric Nursing Excellence will sponsor this event and will cover a portion of the cost.

By participating in this event I will have the opportunity to network with a number of highly regarded researchers In the area of therapeutic recreation and dementia/Alzheimer's disease. This setting will provide the opportunity to meet and greet these individuals and to be kept abreast of the most recent research in this arena. I will also be given the opportunity to become involved in a large research project in an area that I have much interest and some level of expertise. I think it will be a wonderful opportunity for Arkansas Tech University, especially the Recreation and Park Administration Department and in the long run will assist us with recruiting future therapeutic recreation students. In my personal opinion it will be a positive experience for all.

Process for Attainment of Objectives/Goals:

The event will take place between the University of Southern Maine in Portland, Maine and Nancy Richeson's (Professor at USM) house in Alfred, Maine. The Hartford Center for Geriatric Nursing Excellence will also be sponsoring the event. A number of prominent researchers in the area of therapeutic recreation and Alzheimer's disease/dementia will be attending and presenting at this event.

Dissemination of Results:

I will utilize the information gained from this event in my classroom teaching and hope to eventually be included in presentations/publications that will come out of the research project or grant. I see this as being a win-win scenario for all.
