ABSTRACT

I have attended the following conference:

Midwest Association of Canadian Studies. Kansas City, MO. February 16-17.

At this conference, I presented a paper entitled, "Feminist Borders in the Plays of Dominick Parenteau-Lebeuf" as part of the "Literature of Quebec and Canada" panel. I also served as moderator for a panel entitled, "Québécois Culture and Tradition."

PURPOSE/OBJECTIVES

The purpose of my attending this conference was to present my research in Québécois drama. More specifically, my hope was to generate interest in the playwright Dominick Parenteau-Lebeuf among scholars and Canadophiles in the U.S.

SIGNIFICANCE/NEED

By attending this conference, I was able to meet with other scholars who study the literature of Canada and Quebec. Because the conference is interdisciplinary, I was able to meet and share ideas with Canadian diplomats and with scholars of Canadian history / politics. This new knowledge will help me in my work as a translator. By learning more about Canadian life, I am better able to translate dramas from Quebec. The enhancement of my translation skills then improves my ability to produce translation work for performance at Arkansas Tech and for potential publication. This endeavor benefits the Tech community: I have already begun involving students---for instance, student actors--in the production of translated drama.

PROCESS FOR ATTAINMENT OF OBJECTIVES / GOALS

In February, I traveled to Kansas City for the Midwest Association of Canadian Studies Conference, held at the Intercontinental Hotel.

DISSEMINATION OF RESULTS

I plan to submit my paper, "Feminist Borders in the Plays of Dominick Parenteau-Lebeuf," to the *Journal of Drama Studies*. I used the conference as an opportunity to meet individuals connected with the Alliance française and the Francophone community of Kansas City. I promoted my translations of Parenteau-Lebeuf's work among these individuals.

"The Feminist Translator"

In my dissertation, I examine the intersections of writing, feminism, and performance through my example translation of *Dévoilement devant notaire* (*Unveiling While the Notary Watches*) by the Québécois dramatist Dominick Parenteau-Lebeuf. Because this play deals with issues of gender and the legacy of 1970s feminism, my analysis uses techniques from the field of feminist translation theory. My study examines gender in the text on three levels: on a linguistic level, I develop strategies for capturing in English the gendered conventions of the French language; on a dramaturgical level, I discuss the play's treatment of coming of age as women and men in the 21st century; on a cultural level, I situate Parenteau-Lebeuf within the context of contemporary Francophone Canadian theatre.
