# **Abstract**

I plan to attend the Association for Applied and Clinical Sociology Annual Conference on October 26-28, 2006, in San Jose, California. I will present a research article entitled "Long-term Care Workers and Bureaucracy: The Occupational Ritualization of Maltreatment in Nursing Homes and Recommended Policies." Using 40 biographies, autobiographies, and research monographs to examine nursing homes, it reviews various symbolic themes expressed through daily work rituals in nursing homes. Using structural ritualization theory, it suggests that certain symbolic practices influence negative behaviors of nursing home employees contributing to the unintended maltreatment of residents. The paper also indicates alternative policies can generate work rituals with the potential to replace or offset the negative impacts of bureaucracy on maltreatment. Attending this conference will enhance my understanding of applied and clinical sociology in relation to this research. It will also allow me to expose this research to colleagues in the field of sociology.

# Purpose/Objectives

The primary purpose of this conference presentation is to further my research agenda. It currently focuses on the examination of nursing home abuse, nursing home law, and the influence of ritualized deviance on various organizational environments. Attending this conference will also enhance my teaching effectiveness and classroom performance. It will increase my understanding of applied and clinical sociology providing me an enhanced adequacy when discussing these sub-fields of sociology in the classroom.

# Significance/Need

As mentioned, attending this conference is significant because it will allow me to share my research with other colleagues in the field and bring back knowledge to share with students at Arkansas Tech University. However, it will also serve as a way for me to seek publication outlets for this research. Many scholars who act as journal reviewers will attend. Specifically, Jay Weinstein, editor of the journal *Applied Social Science* will be present. I have corresponded with him on my paper and I will be targeting his journal for publication after the conference.

# Process for Attainment of Objectives/Goals

I will travel to San Jose, California, on October 26, 2006. I will attend the Association for Applied and Clinical Sociology Annual Conference on October 27-28, and will return on October 29, 2006. The conference will be held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in San Jose, California.

#### **Dissemination of Results**

Once I have presented this research at the conference, I will submit it for publication in the peer-refereed journal *Applied Social Science*.

## **Budget**

The total cost associated with attending this conference is \$1,218.32. I received \$600.00 from the College of Liberal and Fine Arts and Department of Behavioral Sciences. I am requesting a professional development grant in the amount of \$618.32 to cover the remainder of my travel expenses.
