ABSTRACT

The proposed project is research on a very timely subject, "Child Obesity". Two presenters, Dr. Kevin C. Costley and Byra L. Ramsey, will give a national presentation of a research paper titled, "Childhood Obesity: A Heavy Problem" The youth of today are faced with a "big" problem: they are becoming obese. The time of children playing outside all day and staying active has been taken over by the television and video games. In the same sense, the days of sitting down as a family and eating a good, healthy meal have been replaced by the rush to the nearest fast food restaurant. Today's children are tomorrow's future, and the future does not look healthy for both children and adults. Today's adults are yesterday's youth. It is vital that we teach children proper nutrition and teach them how to stay physically fit. Today, there is much emphasis on academic mastery with core classes. With this emphasis on mastery and high stakes testing, children are not getting an adequate amount of physical or health education. Living a healthy lifestyle will not only improve the quantity of life, but also the quality of life. The nation's schools, including schools in Arkansas, must allow more time for daily physical activity, health classes, and helping young children make healthy choices with food. The state of Arkansas already has extended physical education instructional time which will begin in August of 2007. It is now time to address obesity because obesity is a "heavy problem."

PURPOSE/OBJECTIVES

The purpose is to bring up and promote awareness of the most recent research confronting childhood obesity and the necessity of implementing proactive, pre-service teacher training in this much neglected area. The published information will be included in Arkansas Tech University's "Children and Families in a Diverse Society" course. We believe that "obesity" is a diversity too. It is our goal to integrate this information as a common thread throughout several pre-service courses.

SIGNIFICANCE/NEED

Although research has been conducted by the presenters, this project is a "professional enhancement project." The research will inspire other faculty members in the School of Education, specifically early childhood professors, to implement and integrate some type of lesson plans in various courses in our curriculum. The research shows that healthy children are often better learners in core academic subjects. There is great significance in cautiously and gently confronting a once "taboo subject" for fear of offending overweight people. Teachers should be advocates for all children to achieve healthy lifestyles, including teachers themselves. This content should also inspire faculty members of ATU to make more conscious responsible choices when it comes to food intake and exercise output.

PROCESS FOR ATTAINMENT OF OBJECTIVES/GOALS

The presenters will present pertinent research/information and participate in a round table discussion at the National conference of the Association of Teacher Educators in San Diego, in February of 2007. The paper will be presented on the dangers of childhood obesity. Attendees will receive a "manual in progress" that will be incorporated in one or more Arkansas Tech University courses during the fall semester of 2007. A focus will target how the regular classroom teacher can include this topic in the regular classroom and not leave this topic the sole responsibility of physical education teachers. Attendees will be encouraged to ask questions and give supporting opinions. It is the presenters' hope that a lively, vigorous discussion on this current issue will evolve.

DISSEMINATION OF RESULTS

As stated previously, results from the research will be disseminated in early childhood classes at Arkansas Tech University. The research paper will be submitted to a referreed Kansas state journal with an audience of primarily university professors. The eventual goal is to publish a reprint of this article in a classroom teacher journal.
