Multiple Realities in Teacher Education: Exemplars that Address Dilemmas, Conundrums, and Processes

B. Abstract

The Association of Teacher Educators was founded in 1920 and is an individual membership organization devoted solely to the improvement of teacher education both for school-based and post secondary teacher educators. ATE members represent over 700 colleges and universities, over 500 major school systems, and the majority of state departments of education. The ATE office is located in the Washington DC area where it represents its members' interests before governmental agencies and education organizations. In addition, ATE has representatives on the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education and the Holmes Partnership.

The Association of Teacher Educators has a conference in February and a conference in the summer. The 2007 ATE Summer Conference will be held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. There are Pre-Conference workshops on "Violence in the Schools" and presentations that address Recruitment of diverse Populations into Basic and advanced Programs, Clinical/Field Experiences and Internship, Policy Making; Research Methodologies, Program Design, and Evaluation, and Career—long Professional Development Programs for Teachers.

I have been active in this organization since 2000. I am currently the Arkansas Association of Teacher Educators President. I am the Co-Chair of the Program Committee for the Milwaukee conference. I am the member at-large for the Council of Unit Presidents and Chair of the Special Interest Group for Middle Level Education. I am also a member of the 2006 ATE Leadership Academy.

C. Objectives

I will be a co-presenter with Vera Lang from the University of Arkansas Monticello, and Kandis Croom from ATU. The title of our presentation is "Multiple Realities in Teacher Education: Exemplars that characterize the Disparity of Teaching in a Southern State – Arkansas. This presentation is directly related to the conference theme.

D. Significance/Needs

The disparity of salaries and resources is a large one in the state of Arkansas. An article in the Arkansas Democrat Gazette indicated that the average teaching salary for teacher in the state of Arkansas was \$45,000. Teachers in Southern Arkansas and in the Delta region of the state would arguer that this average salary is dictated by the salaries of teachers in Northwest Arkansas.

In our presentation, we will provide the participants with several realities that present dilemmas for teachers, administrators and teacher educators. In states where this disparity is prevalent, and in areas where effective teachers are needed, teacher's salaries, hiring practices, National Board Certification, resources, professional develop and the skill levels of teachers are a genuine concern.

The theme of the ATE Summer Conference in Milwaukee is "Multiple Realities in Teacher Education: Exemplars that Address Dilemmas, Conundrums, and Processes. We will present our paper at this conference.


