We have one article published, and are excited about adding to our research. By attending this conference, we have moved forward, professionally and personally, and helped inspire — Middle Level educators, specifically the middle level Special Interests Group (SIG). Our presentation was especially related to the conference theme.

Need

A very important component of middle level education is an advisory program. The advisory program is a key to the adjustment of the early adolescent to the changes in their bodies, their interaction with other students, and their relationship with their school and community.

One of the most important components of a developmentally responsive middle school is an adult advocate for every student. Recommendations have been made by National Middle School Association (NMSA) through *This We Believe*, and the nine cornerstone strategies from *Breaking the Ranks*...report advisory program development for every middle school is a must.

Advisory programs facilitate students becoming involved in developmentally appropriate activities which will help them explore the world that is opening to them. As our society become more diverse, many students have the additional adjustment of

changing ethnic and cultural populations within their school and community.

Advisory programs date back to as early as the 1880's. Programs make connections to adults for the young adolescent and also provide a positive interaction with other young adolescents. Active participation by conference participants will lead to a better understanding of the need to use advisory programs to meet the developmental needs of the young adolescent.

Attainment of Objective

We presented research and findings to our recent survey. We sent our 193 surveys to Arkansas Middle Level Educators. We received over a 70% return. We lead a discussion which informed, and hopefully motivated and inspired educators to reinvestigate the key component of the middle level concept, which I believe is advisory groups.

The conference was the Annual Conference for the Association of Teacher Educators (ATE). The conference was held in Chicago, IL. The international office for ATE is in Alexandria, VA. David Ritchey is the Executive Secretary.
