Restatement of Professional Enhancement Opportunity

The professional development grant received was to attend the Arkansas Bar Association 2019 Annual Meeting in Hot Springs, Arkansas, June 12-14. The purpose of my participation in this professional development event was to earn Continuing Legal Education (CLE) credits to maintain my license to practice law in Arkansas, update my knowledge in numerous areas of the law, learn new teaching methods appropriate to this subject, and network with other professionals in my academic field.

Brief Review of the Professional Enhancement Opportunity

I attended the Arkansas Bar Association 2019 Annual Meeting. The Arkansas Bar Association is the primary professional organization for attorneys in the state of Arkansas. Founded in 1898, the Arkansas Bar Association is a private, nonprofit, voluntary association of over 5,000 attorneys. The association's mission is to advance the administration of justice; promote high standards of learning, integrity, and competence among attorneys; and conduct a program of continuing legal education among attorneys. Accordingly, the annual meeting offers Continuing Legal Education (CLE) credits for licensed attorneys.


Summary of Findings, Outcomes, or Experiences

The ATU College of Business is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), which requires business faculty members to remain academically qualified in their professional disciplines. At the meeting, I earned 12.5 credits of CLE, included 2 credits in Ethics, which enables me to maintain my license to practice law in Arkansas. This credential is an important qualification for professors in the legal field.

By attending the presentations at this conference, I was able to update my knowledge on several important topics, such as employment law, medical marijuana, ethics, criminal law, constitutional law, and legal issues related to technology. The program for the conference is attached. I also gained new ideas for teaching business law and engaging students in the classroom and networked with other professionals in my field. These contacts are a valuable source of information, and they often come to ATU as guest speakers in my classes.

Conclusions and Recommendations

The interaction with participants and presenters was educational and motivational for me both as an instructor and as a member of the legal profession. I developed new expertise in business law and ethics and gained new ideas and insights for teaching this material. By earning Continuing Legal Education credits, I also fulfilled requirements needed to maintain my academic and professional qualifications necessary for accreditation with AACSB. The Arkansas Bar Association Annual Meeting is an excellent professional development opportunity that I would recommend to other professors in my field.

Joshua Koskoff is the attorney who represents 10 families who lost a child or spouse in the shooting at Sandy Hook Flementary School in 2012. The lawsuit, Soto v. Bushmaster, which has been closely followed by national news media, alleges that Remington Arms Company marketed and sold the AR-15 used in the shootingwhich took 26 lives in less than five minutesnegligently and in violation of the Connecticut **Unfair Trade Practices** Act.



Mark Lanterman is the Chief Technology Officer of Computer Forensic Services and former member of the U.S. Secret Service Flectronic Crimes Taskforce. Mark will discuss recent high-profile cyber crime events, including website breaches and particularly dangerous types of threats that might affect individuals involving the Dark Web, the Internet of Things, phishing, and Wi-Fi attacks. Additionally. he will demonstrate the value of leveraging digital evidence and ESI in the courtroom.


