 - A. It has been well over 10 years since the International Baccalaureate (IB) has been reviewed. Hot Springs World Class High School, a public magnet secondary school located in Hot Springs, is a participant in the IB program. Since several of these graduates have matriculated to Arkansas Tech, it has been discovered that all of the IB exams aren't listed in the Tech catalog as accepted exams. Included are the following:
 - 1. Change the number of hours allowed for transfer from 24 hours to 30 hours.
 - 2. Request to add new exams and update several articulations for some current exams based on working with each department head.
 - 3. Current listing of IB exams in the 2022-23 Catalog.

I would like to recommend the requested changes go into effect immediately.

 The current IB (International Baccalaureate) Diploma allows up to 24 semester credit hours of undergraduate general education courses. In order to align with ADHE Arkansas Department of Higher Education policy allowing up to 30 total semester credit hours, I would like recommend the 24 semester credit hours limit be changed to up to 30 semester credit hours.

Below would be the updated catalog description:

IB (International Baccalaureate) Diploma

Students who successfully complete the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, with a minimum score of four on each examination, will be granted up to 30 semester credit hours of undergraduate general education courses. ATU may grant fewer than 30 semester credit hours if the student received a score of less than four on an examination administered as part of the IB Diploma Programme. Arkansas Tech University recognizes the rigor of Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate Programme (IB), and the College Level Examination Program (CLEP). Students who have scored accordingly on an AP, IB, or CLEP exam can earn credit toward graduation at Arkansas Tech University by receiving a qualifying score on the examinations. These credits can satisfy general education requirements.

Students who have already earned a grade in a course may not earn duplicate credit through advanced credit. Advanced credit is not used to calculate a student's grade point average, and therefore, cannot be used to retain scholarship awards.

AP, CLEP, and IB scores should be documented on your application for admission. Submit official score reports or readable copies embossed by your high school to the Office of Admissions. Students who have earned International Baccalaureate (IB) credit should submit their IB transcript for evaluation.

No more than a total of 30 semester hours of correspondence, extension, military service, or credit by examination work may be applied as credit towards a degree.

Students who successfully complete the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, with a minimum score of four on each examination, will be granted 24 semester credit hours of undergraduate general education courses. ATU may grant fewer than 24 semester credit hours if the student received a score of less than four on an examination administered as part of the IB Diploma Programme.
