At the conclusion, the student will develop a strategic recommended plan of action based on the findings from the empirical research. The student will demonstrate presentation ability, appropriate leadership styles, critical thinking, and communications skills in a formal presentation of the strategic plan to the group responsible for implementing the strategies; and
- 2. Modify PS 4003: Capstone Project, FROM: This course capstones the process conducted in PS 3003 by requiring the student to demonstrate competencies required of a professional in the student's specialty area in an actual business or industry setting. The student will assume a leadership role in presenting the outcomes of the needs assessment to a group of company stakeholders. On the basis of empirical research conducted throughout the assessment process, the student will recommend relevant strategies for addressing the identified problem/s. A review of the literature will serve to either validate or reject the strategies selected. A continuous process improvement model will be developed along with a detailed continuous process improvement plan which must be approved and accepted by all relevant stakeholders. The final component of the course will require the student to demonstrate presentation ability, appropriate leadership styles, critical thinking, and communications skills in a formal presentation of the strategic plan to the group responsible for implementing the strategies; TO: This course is the concluding course for the Professional Studies degree program. In PS 4003, students develop an ePortfolio highlighting various competencies learned as a BPS student. The course prepares the BPS student with the skills, knowledge, and ability to communicate a critical understanding of his/her work through the articulation of goals, critique, and self-assessment. The course introduces students to the portfolio development process and improves their ability to think critically and communicate more effectively while developing personal goals and mission statements, understanding personal leadership styles, researching career options related to his/her concentration or focused area of study, working collaboratively with other students on competency-based case studies, and engaging in critical inquiry of the role Higher Education plays in one's life.

College of Natural and Health Sciences – Department of Nursing

The student will assume a leadership role in presenting the outcomes of the needs assessment to a group of company stakeholders. On the basis of empirical research conducted throughout the assessment process, the student will recommend relevant strategies for addressing the identified problem/s. A review of the literature will serve to either validate or reject the strategies selected. A continuous process improvement model will be developed along with a detailed continuous process improvement plan which must be approved and accepted by all relevant stakeholders. The final component of the course will require the student to demonstrate presentation ability, appropriate leadership styles, critical thinking, and communications skills in a formal presentation of the strategic plan to the group responsible for implementing the strategies; TO: This course is the concluding course for the Professional Studies degree program. In PS 4003, students develop an ePortfolio highlighting various competencies learned as a BPS student. The course prepares the BPS student with the skills, knowledge, and ability to communicate a critical understanding of his/her work through the articulation of goals, critique, and self-assessment. The course introduces students to the portfolio development process and improves their ability to think critically and communicate more effectively while developing personal goals and mission statements, understanding personal leadership styles, researching career options related to his/her concentration or focused area of study, working collaboratively with other students on competency-based case studies, and engaging in critical inquiry of the role Higher Education plays in one's life.

Recommendations for Online Learning

Ideally, the fastest connection available that you can reasonably afford. Here are some ranges for the low and high end of connections and what you can expect from each.

1.5 to 5 Mbps: You will need at least 1.5 Mbps to use most of the functions required of an online course, and to access anything that requires high definition streaming or video conferencing, you will need at least 4 Mbps. These recommendations come from the FCC, and account for only using one device at a time. If you've got multiple users and multiple devices, you will need to find a faster connection, and even if you don't, you may notice performance issues in the lower ranges, especially during peak hours.

6 to 15 Mbps: Don't want to end up frustrated with a slow connection? Most students will find that somewhere between 10 and 15 Mbps is enough to most things online with relative ease. This range also allows for more wiggle room if others are using your home connection or if you end up needing to do more than one activity online at once. Keep in mind that while your connection may technically be able to provide whatever speed it promises that it might not always do so, so it's a good idea to have more speed than you need.

15 Mbps and Up: High speed Internet is defined as speeds of 25 Mbps and up and service is available that delivers even a whopping 300 Mbps (though 150 and under is much more common). Do you need this much speed for an online course? In most cases, probably not, but if you can afford it, it's not a bad investment. Part of the appeal of online education is its convenience and flexibility, and a slow Internet connection can not only reduce those benefits but also hamper your ability to learn.

Bottom line: faster is better, but only within the constraints of what you can afford. For courses that don't require a lot of streaming or high volume uploading or downloading, a super high speed connection is more of a luxury than a necessity. However, students shouldn't consider anything under 1.5 Mbps (this is the minimum requirement to use Blackboard) and should ideally have service that offers at least 4 Mbps. To get the performance you're used to in most school or work settings, 10 Mbps or more will likely be required.

Rationale for change:

Currently, the majority of new graduate students entering the EMHS program are under-prepared for the standard of research rigor being expected in EMHS 6103. It is the expectation that students completing EMHS 6103 complete anti-plagiarism, APA 6, empirical research skill, and CITI human subject research training and certification in addition to creating foundational chapters I and II of a thesis or practicum project. An under-prepared student has very little time to get up to speed. This under-preparation is evident in multiple areas including library skills, identification of appropriate research support resources, and familiarity with the technology required to complete the required preparatory training and produce the foundational document required to move forward in either the pursuit of a thesis or practicum project. The lack of appropriate preparation is most evident in the exceptionally poor technical writing skill of the majority of these students.

In order to ensure that our students are able to move forward and be successful in the EMHS program without sacrificing our commitment to increased standards of academic and research rigor, many of these students require more time to assume the skills necessary. In the past two semesters, these students have not demonstrated any lack of effort or commitment but rather, have had to sacrifice enrollment in other courses in order to devote all of their energy to this course to avoid a C or lower grade. A number of students have taken Incompletes in the course due to outside events beyond their control, but some have simply dropped out of the program or accepted a grade which has impeded or will impede their ability to successfully complete the EMHS program because they could not qualify for an Incomplete.

The graduate faculty of the Department of Emergency Management would like to propose a change to the assessment method for this course to allow a student who does not qualify for an Incomplete, an opportunity to continue to work on his/her project without negatively impacting his/her GPA for a single semester. While the time to degree may be delayed by a semester, the ability to meet the minimum required GPA and complete a rigorous and meaningful thesis or practicum project outweighs that potential downside. Instead of the standard grading scale (A-F, I), we would like to propose offering A, B, F or R. Under this scale, an R would become an F if the project remains

incomplete at the end of the following semester. A student would not be allowed to take a second R in the introductory research course. (The department would retain the right to consider appeals on a case-by-case basis regarding the extension of the R for an additional semester(s) due to extenuating circumstances.)

As a result of this change, students who do not have exceptional personal events occur in their lives would be afforded the same opportunity for an extension as those that have qualified for an Incomplete in the past. This extension could provide the time necessary for under-prepared students to gain the skills required to prepare a strong foundation with which to pursue a successful thesis or practicum project and contribute to our discipline and field as both scholars and practitioners.

On the basis of empirical research conducted throughout the assessment process, the student will recommend relevant strategies for addressing the identified problem/s. 
