II. Presentation Kurt Jones (City Engineer)

Presentation 1: Russellville Development Plan

- Main project is the O Street improvement project (2015)
 - 3 lanes, sidewalks and bike trails on both sides, lined with trees and lights, Storm drains will be underground
 - Estimated to be a 10 month project
- Reasoner (2016), Glenwood (2017), L and H (2018) street expansions
- Will create a loop around campus and provide more access to emergency vehicles.
 - Provides alternate route for drivers and alleviates congestion at busier intersections leading to campus.
- The biggest challenge is completing the Prairie Creek crossing

Open Discussion/Questions:

- Can a left hand turn be put in at the O Street and Arkansas intersection?
 - City plans to improve this intersection for pedestrians
- Could a roundabout work at this intersection?
 - Possible but does not solve the problem of pedestrian crossing.
 - There is also a drainage issue due to an undersized drainage system.

III. Presentation Justin Smith (Chief Business and Community Outreach Officer- Ozark) Presentation 2: Ozark Campus Business and Community Outreach

- Provides industry training
 - Ex.-Partnership with Green Bay Packing Center in Morrilton.
 - Green Bay Packing employees provide the training.
 - Train almost 30 companies in classes made up of 12 trainees in electrical and technical training
- Customized contract training
 - If Ozark does not offer the training, then find someone who does and set up the course for the company.
 - This gives Ozark access to additional funding.
- Provides Leadership Program-10 months

- Ex.- Invites children K-12 to campus for various activities and outreach programs.
- Involved with a lot of Chambers from surrounding communities.
- Campus advertising at various events and chambers.
- Career and professional development activities and events on campus.
 - Provide space for organizations and in return they get to experience the campus.
 - \circ Events are often held on campus to engage the community.
- Ozark assists industry with accessing grant funds/grant writing.
- VESTA Program (Viticulture and Enology Science)
 - Wine and grape education
- 18 school districts are tied to Ozark Campus.
- Ozark does not have an official Career Services Department.

Open Discussion/Question: What are the benefits to the University that flow from high-functioning and mutually beneficial programs or shared services with surrounding towns? Can we develop an inventory of the existing collaborations that are successful examples?

- Education and economic growth go hand in hand.
- Silo approach doesn't work. Departments need to work together.

 - Outside conferences
- Should Tech have a central clearing house for internship collaborations?
- Should Tech increase its standards?
- Is it better that Ozark and the Main Campus become one University?
 - We do not share the same handbook.
 - What is our obligation to the state?
 - Does Ozark and the Main campus provide different services and meet different needs of students?
