Proceedings: I.

- Discuss ATU's relationship and voice in State Government
 - President and 1 lobbyist left to handle all communication
 - Jeff Hogart is the current lobbyist hired as needed
 - ATU lobbying has improved in the past year
 - Should ATU have a full time lobbyist who can keep the lines of communication open with current legislature?

• Need someone who can answer questions about higher education

- How are we viewed by state officials?
 - Tech is now viewed more positively, but there are some negatives that we need to overcome.
- When you consider Tech's identity, what do you see?
 - Tech is traditionally known as an agricultural school
- Fact sheets would be helpful. Tech needs to share its best kept secrets.
 - \circ Tech has more STEM students than any other AR school
 - 92% of Tech students are Arkansans
 - Second largest freshman class in the state
 - o Tech has at least one student enrolled from each county in Arkansas
 - Tech has a beautiful campus
 - We are emerging into something new/different
 - Tech students are serving Arkansas
 - Tech has third largest enrollment numbers in the state
- How are we marketing ourselves?
 - President and lobbyist should both be present in Capital
 - Tech needs to change funding approach
 - Need to build up practical marketing strategies
 - Have a Tech Day at the Capital (possibly in April)
 - Tech should market itself to the group who will be voting on funding
 - Relationships need to be built
 - Letters should be sent to legislatures who are voted in
 - Tech has connections (alumni) throughout government
 - Need clear understanding of the product we are marketing
 - Need to market more in local communities

- Invite state officials to campus, and offer for them to hold meetings on campus or at Lake Point
 - Lake Point will be renovated and open to the public on weekends
 - Veterans caucus should meet at Tech
 - State Police and Game and Fish Committee
- Funding has been reviewed to evaluate what changes can be made
 - Funding formula needs to be changed
 - Funding needs to be performance driven
 - Tech has done the best they can without state funds
- Tech should capitalize on fact that Arkansans are 92% of Tech enrollment
- What schools are most effective in their lobbying efforts?
 - Tech should come up with their own unique way of marketing itself to legislature
 - Send message that Tech will not follow other schools
 - Tech needs to be on a more level playing field
- Look at where the House sits on issues
 - Could talk about the reputation of legislature
- Who goes to the capital?
 - Tech lobbyist and additional people depending on the need
 - Need an honest relationship with legislature

 - Should we address the renovation of El Paso in the paper?
 - There has been questions about this and it may be good to include it
 - We should also add the Greenwood extension to the paper
 - Add Track & Field as an example of additional sports that could be added to sports program
 - Should we change priority of lobbyist after today's meeting?
 - Should add, but change title to Governmental Relations Officer or Government Liaison
 - Is twelve too many?
 - Not all of the initiatives will go through, but paper will serve as a public record
 - Should we add information about Public Safety accreditation and needing additional staff?
 - Does accreditation address the issue of lack of staff?
 - Accreditation process has already been started
 - Need to note that students need assistance with seeking professional schools
 - Need help with applying to law school and med school
 - Change language for the Career Services piece to address this issue
 - Russellville had over 270 volunteers participate in Paint the Town. Many Tech students participated.

 - National organization promoting service learning and civic engagement
