I have questions regarding eligibility or criteria for Who's Who?

Students are selected for Who's Who based upon:

Academic achievement

Service to the community while enrolled at Tech

Leadership and involvement in co-curricular activities

Potential for continued success

Undergraduate students eligible to apply are those who:

Are full-time students (must be currently enrolled in at least 12 hours)

Have completed at least 90 hours by the end of the fall in which the student is applying.

Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.75

Have not previously received this honor

Graduate students eligible to apply are those who:

Are full-time students (graduate assistants - 6 hours | all other graduate students - 9 hours)

Have completed at least 12 graduate hours by the end of the fall in which the student is applying.

Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.25

Have not previously received this honor

When is the application due?

The application deadline is in January annually. Please check https://www.atu.edu/campuslife/whoswho.php for the specific deadline date.

Why is my resume important?

The resume will be reviewed for content as well as professionalism.

Staff members in Norman Career Services can assist you with resume critique. Please feel free to take advantage of this free service in Rothwell, Suite 107.

Comprehensive reporting of involvement through your resume is critical for the review committee in considering which students will be recognized.

Examples of things to include in your resume:

- Awards: On-campus or off-campus recognition of excellence in an area or specific topic.
- Certifications: Any classes or instruction in which a student gained a new skill or area of competency.
- **Community Service:** Service work in the community or another community such as Alternative Spring Break, mission trips, and/or on-going volunteering with specific agencies. Include # of service hours logged at Tech.
- Internships: Any period of time during which a student acquires experience in an occupation or profession.
- **Music and Theater:** Any experience in which a student participates in an activity that showcases music and theater, such as marching band, ensembles, singing, plays, etc.
- National, Regional, State, or Community Organization Involvement: Involvement in an organization that is not a Registered Student Organization at Arkansas Tech University.
- **Sports:** Any experience in which a student participates in athletic activity such as collegiate athletics or intramural sports.
- **Student Employment:** On-campus jobs for which a student is paid (by fellowship or hourly).
- **Student Media:** Participation in on-campus media such as newspaper, radio, or television.
